## **Facilities Update**

The District has had several larger projects at or near completion in the recent months.

To start off, we have done some work at Station 82 and 83 on the apparatus aprons. Station 83 received some rut patching in front of T-83 and the parking lot striping was repainted. The parking and apparatus apron at 82 was crack-filled and seal-coated as well as new parking striping.

At Station 85, the draft site pipe was repaired and anchored with the help of Assistant Chief Alley.

The Memorial at Station 80 was prepped and received new sod with the help of Chief Carriger, Matt Aalto, Jordon Iremonger, and Robert Clark. Thanks to all who helped; it looks great.

The digital sign has been installed at Station 80 by Meyer Sign Company and looks great. The District will be using the sign for district and public service announcements.

We will also be replacing the transfer switch on the backup generator to replace the damaged unit.











September 12th, at about 12:30 pm Stayton Fire District was called to 41084 Huntley RD in Stayton for a field fire. The field was a mixed-use field that contained brush and Christmas trees. Because of the weather conditions and the lack of water in the area it was quickly determined that more resources were needed. Fourteen agencies and about 70 firefighters responded to the scene. The fire

was held to under eight acres. No buildings were involved in the fire. There were no injuries and no dollar loss.

#### **November 1, 2015**

An early morning four-alarm fire destroyed a home at the corner of Evergreen and W. Ida in Stayton. Fortunately, there were no injuries from the fire. The fire was reported shortly after midnight, called in by a passerby. The large residence with the wrought



iron fence, was a familiar Stayton landmark. Cause of the fire was determined to be electrical, starting in the garage.
