Going through my old notes and found this – It would be great to have something like this that all volunteers can be involved in and be a great education / prevention tool for our community. Would take some planning and coordinating for sure.

\*Kids Safety Camp – summer day camp for different age groups – bicycle safety, smoke alarms, seatbelts, learn address/phone numbers (for small kids), when to call 911, cooking safety, fire safety, provide fingerprinting kits .... Use games and puppets, videos, skits, take home handouts for parents.

Kind of like Halloween event but more structured teaching on various topics. Can have safety stations set up and then group leaders that take kids to each station on a schedule. Have a first aid station set up.

Can coordinate with Food Bank for lunches maybe. Involve Police and Ambulance personnel and neighboring districts. Possibly get sponsors (like insurance companies) for bags/drawstring backpacks and give away items.
